NOTICE OF MOTION AND MOTION FOR PARTIAL SUMMARY JUDGMENT AS TO THE CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that defendants will move pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 56 for partial summary judgment as to the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) in the Courtroom of the Hon. A. Howard Matz on October 31, 2005, at 10 a.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard. This motion will seek the entry of summary judgment in favor of defendants as to the CIA, and the dismissal of all claims with respect thereto, except any claim involving the application of 5 U.S.C. § 552(b) to any record, created by the CIA, that is still undergoing review by the CIA as of the date of the order and judgment and is responsive to the request under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. § 552, that plaintiff submitted to the CIA by letter dated October 8, 2003.

The grounds for this motion are that no genuine issue of material fact exists and that defendants are entitled to partial summary judgment as to the CIA as a matter of law. The grounds for this motion are set forth in the memorandum of points and authorities submitted herewith, and upon such other and further arguments, documents, and grounds as may be advanced to the Court in the future. This motion is made following the conference of counsel pursuant to L.R. 7-3 which took place on July 1, 2005.
